cha·grin (shə-grīn')

n. A keen feeling of mental unease, as of annoyance or embarrassment, caused by failure, disappointment, or a disconcerting event

To her chagrin, the party ended just as she arrived.

To cause to feel chagrin; mortify or discomfit:

He was chagrined at the poor sales of his book.
